3.	Do you know which medications used in your feed mill will require a VFD or remain over the counter (OTC) come January 1, 2017?		
4.	Do you know which approved OTC/VFD medication combinations are used in your feed mill?		
5.	Have you identified a location to store copies of all VFDs that are sent to your feed mill to be fulfilled?		
6.	Do you have a plan in place to identify the quantity of feed needed to fulfill the VFD?		
7.	Do you manufacture your own feed, manufacture feed for other clients, floor stock VFD medications or sell VFD medications (bagged Type C feed or Type A/B VFD medications)?		
8.	If yes to Question 7, have you submitted an Intent to Distribute VFD feeds form to the FDA so you may sell feeds which require a VFD?		
9.	If yes to Question 7, do you have an Acknowledgment of Distribution form on file for all feed mill locations with all distributors you purchase medications from that will require a VFD?		
10	. If yes to question 7, do you have a Medicated Feed Mill License (MFML) to manufacture Type A Category II premixes requiring a VFD?		
11	. If no to Question 10, do you have a process in place to identify which medications are appropriate for inventory in your feed mill?		
12	. Have you identified a location to store records of VFD manufacturing for one year in accordance with 21 CFR part 225?		
13	. Do you have a plan in place to update your Bluebird labels?		
14	. Do you plan to include a transition label on your Type B/C medications?		
15	. Do you know how you will handle current inventory of Type A/B/C medications on January 1, 2017?
